Transhumanist Bill of Rights, Version 3.0


- Adopted via Electronic, Ranked-Preference Vote on December 2-9, 2018 Integrated from Voting Preferences on December 12, 2018
- The resulting Version 3.0 is available at https://transhumanist-party.org/tbr-3/
- 43 Articles (increase from 6 in Version 1.0 and 25 in Version 2.0)
- Clarifying changes were made in response to some misleading media coverage.
- Article IV: Right to end involuntary suffering does not imply euthanasia. It refers to alleviating suffering through technology.
- Article VII: Right to universal healthcare does not necessarily imply governmentprovided healthcare. Rather, healthcare should be made abundantly available to all through any of a wide range of possible delivery systems.
- Article XIX: Universal basic income is clarified as desirable whether or not automation will displace jobs.
- Provisions of the **United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights** integrated directly into the TBR, generalized to apply to all sentient entities to the extent possible.

Re: Opposition to Assembly Bill 226

Dear Chairwoman Cannizzaro, Vice Chairwoman Harris, and honorable members of the Senate Judiciary Committee:

The United States Transhumanist Party — an alliance of over 1400 members who advocate for transcending the flaws and limitations of the human condition through technology and for putting science, health, and technology at the forefront of American politics — strongly urges the Senate Judiciary Committee to oppose Nevada Assembly Bill 226 because the bill violates the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the non-discrimination provision of the Affordable Care Act, the First Amendment, and the freedom to contract.

AB 226 prohibits a person from participating "in a program established by another person, if the program authorizes a person to voluntarily leter to undergo the implantation of a microchip or other permanent identification marker of any kind or nature."

AB 226 is a violation of the ADA because prohibiting disabled individuals safe access to microchips is deaying a reasonable accommodation. Although the bill permits microchips used for the "diagnosis, monitoring, treatment or prevention of the health condition," this exception is too narrow because the use of an implanted microchip to unlock doors for a disabled individual is not the treatment of a health condition; it is adapting to a health condition with assistive technology. The ADA defines discrimination as "a refusal to make reasonable accommodations in rules, policies, practices, or services, when such accommodations may be necessary to afford such person equal opportunity to use and enjoy a dwelling." 42 U.S. Code § 3604. AB 226 is an unreasonable law that denies accommodations by prohibiting the technology that can improve access to all life areas.

AB 226 is unconstitutional under the non-discrimination provision of Section 1557 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. Microchips have the potential to prevent pregnancy by delivering contraceptives; however, this technology would be prohibited under AB

226 because preventing pregnancy is not the "treatment or prevention of the health condition," unless the Senate considers being a woman a "health condition."

AB 226 is a violation of the First Amendment right to freedom of speech because it prohibits microchips used for self-expression if they transmit a radio frequency. AB 226 only permits microchips for self-expression if they are "incapable of passively or actively transmitting personal information to another device using radio frequency technology," however, freedom of speech includes transmitting speech through a radio frequency, so this prohibition would not pass strict scrutiny. AB 226 is also in violation of the First Amendment right to freedom of association because it prohibits an individual from voluntarily establishing or participating in a microchip program, and this would prohibit many types of associations of people, including corporations and biobacker groups.

AB 226 is a violation of the right to freedom of contract because it restricts a person's right to voluntarily establish or participate in a microchip program; consequently, this includes financial programs that would facilitate the buying and selling of good and services using a microchip. The United States Supreme Court only permits restrictions on the freedom to contract if the restriction serves a legitimate government interest; however, restricting an individual's right to voluntarily make a financial transaction with a microchip does not serve any government interest.

For the foregoing reasons, we respectfully request the honorable members of the Senate Judiciary Committee to oppose AB 226.

Legislative Success in Nevada: Amendment to Assembly Bill 226

- Assembly Bill 226 (AB226), introduced by Assemblyman Skip Daly, would have prohibited most microchip implants, including voluntary implants.
- The USTP took the following measures to respond:
 - Encouraged transhumanists to offer public comments in opposition to AB226
 - Arranged for cyborg magician Anastasia Synn to testify in person in Las Vegas
 - Wrote a letter (from Justin Waters, USTP Legislative Director) to the Senate Judiciary Committee, providing multiple reasons to oppose AB226
 - Together with Anastasia Synn and the Future Grind podcast, arranged the <u>Cyborg and Transhumanist Forum</u> at the Nevada State Legislature on May 15, 2019





Legislative Success in Nevada: Amendment to Assembly Bill 226

- Cyborg and Transhumanist Forum May 15, 2019: First time that an official transhumanist event was held within the halls of a State Legislature.
- Anastasia Synn, Ryan Starr, and Gennady Stolyarov II discussed emerging technologies, life extension, microchip implants, and transhumanist philosophy with tens of individuals – including legislators, lobbyists, and staff members.
- Result: AB226 was amended to <u>remove</u> prohibition on voluntary microchipping. Amended bill <u>only</u> prohibits coerced / required microchipping by governments, employers as a condition of employment, insurers, and bail agents.


- We needed symbols to represent transhumanism in general, without the potential to be confused with representing any particular organization.




U.S. Transhumanist Party Presidential Primary Election

- Open to members from all over the world. This means you, if you register for free at https://transhumanist-party.org/membership/.
- April 5 August 31, 2019: 9 candidates declared so far – Find candidate profiles at https://transhumanist-party.org/candidateprofiles/.
- July 6, 2019: First Virtual Debate August 3, 2019: Second Virtual Debate
- Mid-September 2019: Final debates scheduled two segments of 4-5 candidates each
- September 22, 2019: Electronic, rankedpreference voting opens worldwide, will remain open until at least a 50% member turnout is reached. Out of 1,770 members, 885 would need to vote.


